## Training Report

#### Scouts Australia Institute of Training has won an award.

Scouts Australia Institute of Training won The Brisbane City Council Award for Outstanding Achievement (Organisation).

This category is open to clubs, organisations and enterprises which can be characterised as possessing professionalism and high standards of conduct, that have made a valuable contribution to the outdoor community at large.

#### Recognition of Prior Learning (SR)/Skills Recognition (RPL)

Over the last 12 months we have had a number of requests for RPL. I have reproduced below the SAIT policy on RPL.

Please note that the candidate must fill out the form and provide the evidence. Please note that the evidence submitted must be:

Valid - Evidence collected is relevant to the activity and demonstrates that performance criteria have been met.

In many cases, producing copies of qualifications plus currency is all that is required. Requesting RPL for all of basic training would be rather difficult and time consuming and it would be easier to attend the required training courses.

#### **Policy**

All candidates (Leaders) shall have access to, and be offered Skills Recognition (RPL).

In the first training session, the trainer shall make candidates aware of the SAITs Skills Recognition (SR) (RPL) policy. Trainers will remind candidates of this policy at the beginning of each new program and provide opportunities to engage in the SR (RPL) process.

When approached by a candidate seeking Skills Recognition (RPL), trainers will:

- a. provide the candidate with copies of a Skills Recognition (RPL) Application Form
- b. provide the candidate with information about the types of evidence that can be used to support an SR (RPL) application
- c. make a prompt decision and notify the candidate of the outcome of the SR (RPL) process
- d. update the candidate's records if SR (RPL) is granted

#### **Technical Training Tasks and In-Service Workbook**

Please note that this is mandatory for new Leaders to complete the workbook and have it signed off by the PLA. Leaders changing sections may need to complete some of the workbook. For example a Joey Leader moving to Cubs will need to be able to correctly demonstrate this skill. The PLA and the Leader will need to discuss exactly what needs to be completed.

### Adventurous Activities

Greetings to all Scouters – with the commencement of Daylight Saving, hopefully most Troops/Venturer Units and Crews are now "out and about" doing more activities outdoors with the longer day-light hours now available.

A White-Water Rafting Course has been successfully completed in September and was based at Gowrie Park in Northern Tasmania with a good attendance of Rovers and Leaders enjoying the course.

A Basic Abseiling Course is planned for 3<sup>rd</sup>- 4<sup>th</sup> November based on the tower at The Lea together with a day at Blackmans Bay. Also, please remember that a First Aid qualification is almost mandatory for most qualifications for activities. With the start of the New Year fast approaching, it may be worthwhile to assess whether your First Aid qualifications are either non-existent or requiring up-dating and so, plan the appropriate course of action so as to ensure compliance. There are several First Aid courses listed in the forth-coming Training Calender.

#### Aim of the Badge

BCJS will forward these requests immediately to The Pan Pal program for registration. Name, postal address, group and email address must accompany this request.
- 3. Kelly Johnson will then contact you with your new Link. As soon as you receive the new details, you can start contacting and swapping!

#### Requirements for the Badge:

- 1. Swap badges, name tapes, flag, mascot or whatever your Mob decides.
- 2. Write "postcards" from your Joey Scouts to the overseas children use pictures, photos, collages (only use first names please).
- 3. Leaders to swap a typical program and try to run true to that program. You need to supply all rules for games, describe parade, words to songs, send craft templates or photos of the finished article to assist the other Leaders. You should expect similar in return. ## GRANTS REPORT

Things have now settled down after the frenzy of applications to the TCF and others. I've been very impressed with the standard of submissions and the thorough research and compilation of data etc involved. I hope that all the hard work, in some cases over many months, will reap benefits to all concerned. Also, thanks to Jeannette for putting together the Financial Viability Statement neces-

sary for the TCF over \$10k applications.

We now have to wait for the results of all the applications the first of which will be the VG2012 early next month maybe! Only a couple of Grant Alerts were sent out, the last being the RACT Community Grant. Unfortunately some of these did not leave much time to submit which means that prior preparation was imperative. I've only had ONE report (courtesy & thanks to Mary Figg, Howrah Group) on the FREE Grant Writing Workshops (DPaC) that were held statewide. She said & I quote, "I felt the session was run well by a lady who went through the handbook they provided and gave useful tips and hints throughout. But we found out that we don't have a strategic plan and we don't plan ahead far enough for anything, which in turn means that when a grant comes up, that we think is suitable, we scratch our heads wondering how we can fit the criteria. What we should be doing is having discussions about where we see ourselves as a Group in the long and short term and how we plan to get there, what tools will we need and what sort of assistance is available. Once we have some answers to that, we can 'mould' ourselves into applying for grants with like minded providers". She also comments that it was a positive experience and would highly recommend it to Groups if it's offered again. I'm still working on "Top 10 Tips for getting Grants." I will send this out through BHQ when completed & strangely the first one is very similar to what Mary found out at the Workshop!

The great news this month that I promised last Newsletter has been the statement, received 18<sup>th</sup> October, from the Department of Sport & Recreation Tas. (sent out in a separate announcement). Briefly, it states that, "Sport & Recreation Tas has removed the blanket exclusion of charitable organisations ... which makes us eligible to apply for funding to support projects that have a sport or recreation purpose taking effect for the 2012 -13 Major and Minor Grant Programs".

There are still a few ongoing grants, Junior Landcare, NAB Employee Grant, CheaperthanHotels Fundraising Program. Other Grants such as Telstra's Kids Fund, Bell Bay Aluminium (Pacific Aluminium), St George Funding sent out courtesy Jeannette.

Local Councils Community Grants – George Town (ongoing), Meander Valley Council ongoing, N Midlands ongoing, Launceston City Community Grants Program ongoing. Contact your local Council for info if not listed.

The Grants info promised for mid (?) October has still not arrived and this + the December issue info will be in the next Newsletter. If I find other suitable grants from other sources I will inform you through BHQ.
