

- participate/assist/lead in three activities from the Challenge areas (Creative, Community, Outdoors, Personal Growth), with (at least one activity from each of)
 - their Patrol,
 - their Unit, and
 - o another Group; and
- complete the Stage 3 (or higher) requirements of an Outdoor Adventure Skill from any of the nine streams.

These improvements make it easier for Leaders to record their nightly program and to relate a programmed activity to the Outdoor Adventure Skills. In particular:

- · There has been a simplification of the process for entering programmed activities (you no longer are returned to the calendar multiple times for example!).
- · You can now associate and award I-statements to Youth Member's Outdoor Adventure Skills pathways as part of creating and finalising a programmed activity (eg a nightly program,

bushwalk or camp).

Youth Program

Scouts Terrain has had some recent updates. The Scouts Terrain Steering Committee has provided the following information...

Scouts | Terrain has now reached its third major release. Scouts | Terrain has come a long way in the last few years, like any journey despite the planning there has been some challenges.

Like any project technology project there is so many aspects that can be built out and developed, at each stage we have taken a Plan > Do> Review> approach to ensure the system is meeting the needs of the program and supporting our member to manage modern scouting. Thank you to everyone who has provided feedback via the surveys and via email.

The project has evolved, from an initial release that focused on setting up the basics, such as recording achievement pathways, enabling basic programming and organising groups, units & patrols. The second release aimed to improve user experiences by reworking and streamlining the programming workflow, embedding a calendar function, adding a logbook to support the outdoor adventure skills, and adding notifications to provide updates on approvals.

The third iteration provides the ability for Program support leaders who may not have a role within a group to get more active within the system and support those around them. The major focus of this release was around providing that so the system had ability for the typical support structure of scouting to get involved. Check out system update notes here.

It is as simple as logging in, switching to the Support Leader Role, clicking into Branch Life then searching for the formations you would usually support with your role. You can use this tool to search formations across the branch, each formation will have an aggregate view of how they are using the system across the group. You can even request access to support with almost the same access as a leader who is within group. Check out the Program Support Leader Guide to see how to do each of these functions.

We have also made improvements to troubleshooting with our volunteer support team now having the ability act as if they were any member to help resolve issues more efficiently, reducing the less back and forth.

Now with the third release we have a well-rounded system to manage scout program. The system will continue to evolve and is shaped on your constructive feedback we have received along the way. Program support leaders can now actively support scouting and this is a huge stride forward. The team will continue to Plan > Do > Review > every step of the way. Keep your eyes peeled for the next opportunity to provide feedback and shape the system in H1 of next year.

ADULT RECOGNITION AWARDS 2023

All forms must be in to BHQ by 31st January 2023, and emailed to admin@tas.scouts.com.au

The Awards committee will consider all nominations in February and make recommendations for Awards to the Chief Commissioner by the end of February so that all relevant paperwork can be sent to National Office for processing in March.

Tasmanian Awards are presented by the Governor of Tasmania (Tasmania's Chief Scout) at the Scouts Tasmania AGM, next year to be held on the North West in June.

All the forms and information can be found on MyScout.

These Awards are a crucial way in which the Scouting family in Tasmania (and across the world) recognises the tremendous impact that our adult volunteers have in continuing the great tradition of Scouting, but the system totally relies on nominations being received. Nominations can be completed by anyone, not just limited to those in leadership roles. Across the organisation, our adult volunteers give many hours of support, through youth and adult leadership roles, committee roles and other support roles, and we want to recognise their input and the vital role they have within Scouting.

So, please get out your pen and paper (or computer), complete a nomination for all those adults who put in above and beyond and let us recognise their efforts.

Please note that Awards need to meet the criteria set out in the Guidelines, and that many of the higher Awards require several years of exemplary service – in many cases this is not difficult to achieve.

I look forward to receiving a pile of nominations and the committee being inundated with quality submissions.

Regatta

At time of writing this Regatta update, we only have 10 members registered on MyScout. If anyone is having problems with getting the leaders and youth into the Regatta event, please contact Mike Hovington on mike.hovington@tas.scouts.com.au.

When you get your leaders, youth, and adult helpers (which includes parents/carers) onto the MyScout Regatta Event, you must send Lyn the short cut form (sg.regatta@tas.scouts.com.au) and pay for the adult and youth. It would be appreciated if you would email Lyn to let her know a payment has been made. All information is on the short cut form, which all Scout, Venturer, Rover Adviser should have.

The cheaper rate ends on the 15^{th of} December 2022, so please get your members into the system ASAP.

MyScout

As some leaders would have seen in the last week or so, MyScout has been updated. There are also many updates that have not been implemented yet but will be in the coming weeks and months.

New Youth Member – we will be looking at parents filling in straight into MyScout, which will make it quicker to get the new youth member into the system. Every group will have a QR code for the parent to scan and fill in a quick name and email address. The parent then will get an email with a link to fill in the rest of the information that we need. This will give the new youth member three weeks to say yes or no. If no the information is deleted out of our database. If yes, Branch will bill the group for their new member. We don't know at this stage who will be notified of new member, but we hope the Treasure and the GL, as well as the Branch will be contacted.

Security – we will also be switching on Multi Factor Authentication (MFA) to make our data safer from hackers. An email will be going out to all Adults who have access to MyScout telling them what will happen and when.

The preferred name will be added to the youth member data.

Leaders who have not completed their COAL will be converted to Adult Helper after three years. It is considered that three years is long enough to complete the first part of their training.

Rovers will automatically be deregistered from MyScout from the Rover position on turning 26. If the Rover has other adult roles, they will keep this position.

There is lots of extra reports that Branch can now use, but most leaders and other adults will not need to know any of these.

The Adult Awards will be processed better, with the form being on MyScout to nominate an adult for an award.

Financial returns will be enforced, to make should our organisation complies with all audit requirements. The Event function has also been improved, just in time for the Regatta. We can give a parent a temporary position of Event Member, they will still need to give their WWVP card number before this can be done. This will make it easier to change them back to their parent position after the event.

To come – Adult forms will be replaced by the forms in MyScout. This will make sure the steps are followed and filled in and makes sure the forms don't get lost.
