### Chief's Report

This month I would like to give you all an update on where a few things are at.

The new *State Operations Committee* has been working on how it will most efficiently function. Now that all areas are managed by an Assistant Chief Commissioner, it has been identified that the membership of SOC should be each of the ACCs and their Deputy, the Chair & Vice Chair of TBRC and the Chief Commissioner and the Deputy CC. Additional skills can be seconded as required. Currently Ruth Henderson & Mike Wilson are involved in the set up and review.

Each of the three *Support Area teams* have now met and the outcomes from these meetings determine the Agenda for the State Operations Comittee. With the delegated authority of each area to manage their own portfolios and make decisions that are within policy, the role of the SOC is to deal with matters that require coordination between areas, or may require a review of a Policy.

The Northern Midlands Council has accepted our proposal for the lease of **Avoca School**. There is still a lot of paperwork to sort out between Government Departments so a time frame is not confirmed as yet. It is a terrific site and will provide the Launceston area a multi-purpose facility to replace Carnacoo. Sale proceeds will be utilised to make provisions for our redress obligations, plus make some funding available for improvements to Scout Island access and to the Avoca site. There have been many offers to be on the committee to look after Avoca and thanks to those who have put their hand up. Perhaps the first challenge may be to come up with a suitable name for the property.

**Volunteer Week** gave us all the chance to collectively pat ourselves on the back in recognition of the efforts we all put in for our Organisation. We are part of vast army of volunteers across Australia contributing to our Community and providing services governments do not have the resources to fund. Our Youth benefit with life time experiences from your input and I thank you all on behalf of the State team. Thomas Reed from Cygnet Group, who earned his Queens Scout Award last year, earned the **Young Person of the Year Award 2023** from the Huon Council ( story on page 10 ). Well done Thomas and to the dedicated team of leaders in Cygnet who guided him through his time in Scouting.

# Youth Program Report

The catch phrase, 'Youth Leading, Adults Supporting' should now be familiar to the ears of all involved in Scouting in Australia. The concept is as old as Scouting itself but has been given renewed emphasis with the latest iteration of the Youth Program.

In April, I was fortunate to see a great example of 'Youth Leading, Adults Supporting' when I was able to visit the Western Australian Branch's 'One Camp — Eclipse'. The concept for this event was developed by a Design Squad of Youth members and then put into practice by another huge group of Youth members. For example, one young Rover was in charge of the roll out of all food to all of the sub-camps over the course of the event. He used skills that he has developed in the paid workforce and was supported by a range of others, including adult members.

One of the important things to come out of the review of the 'One Camp' event is that, while youth empowerment was at the core of the event, Youth members still value and seek out adult involvement. After all, the statement does not just say 'Youth Leading'...the 'Adults Supporting' bit is equally important. I would love to hear of great examples from around our state of Youth members being supported by their adults to Plan>Do>Review> in authentic ways. Let me know what you have been up to. I am keen to showcase these stories in future newsletters.

# Wooden Boat Festival update

A few months ago, you will remember Hobart hosted the largest Wooden Boat Festival in the Southern Hemisphere. Scouts Groups in the South supported the event and the challenge was managing cross contamination of compostable items to keep them out of landfill.

An update on this, is Scouts made a huge impact!

WBF organisers have advised of the impact Scouts had on keeping the event clean.

Over the 4 day event, 100% of all compostable bins on site, plus the skip bins were successfully processed as compostable recycling.

This relates to equivalent of 250, 240Ltr bins of compostable recycle saved from land fill or contaminated recycle.



Following on from this outcome, a suppliers has gone one step further. Craig from Bio Pakk donated over 2400 food containers, 1000 water/juice glasses and 4000 cups to be used at the Cuboree. These were delivered to the Lea mid May. We would like to thank Craig for his wonderful support to Scouting with this donation.





### **Numbers**




Scouts numbers have stabilised (which is fantastic!). Let's keep working towards an increase.
