


Looking ahead to next year, please put it in your calendar now: November 16–17th 2024 at Scout Island. The format is a standing camp with cooking on gas.

It was also very pleasing to note that of all the participants in the Wood badge (Scouting Leadership course, all completed the various requirements and were able to be presented with their beads and scarf at the final dinner. This is an outstanding achievement and once again highlights commitment to our youth members by having Leaders who have completed their training. There is always something extra if you wish in the adventurous Activities space, or e-learning electives, to further enhance your skills.

Child Safe has been a major focus this year, with the National policy being reviewed as well as the e-learning mandatory training. As Scouts Tasmania we welcomed Katrina Munting as our new Child Safe Commissioner. Many of you may know Kate as a 1st Derwent Cub Scout leader and as a victim survivor and also a consultant for the new Tasmanian legislation. I will be working closely with Kate on ensuring ALL our Leaders, District and Support personnel and fellowship members, as well as other adults who assist in delivering Scouting have completed the mandatory Child Safe and WHS modules and are current with WWVP and other requirements.

It is hoped that an up-dated TOPS will be available early in 2024. To ensure that everyone is working from the same document we will not be printing them off but the most current document will be on MyScout and also the website. This is to ensure that as changes are required TOPS can be up-dated immediately, rather than waiting years for it to be amended and then printed (making it out of date as soon as you get a copy!).

As we move towards a new structure designed to assist our Leaders deliver the program, please always communicate any concerns, wins and suggestions for improvement. None of us is infallible and we can always improve with help of other with the same goals – that is that Scouting in Tasmania is the top youth organisation providing a broad ranging programme full of fun, adventure, knowledge and inclusion.

Clark Trophy Communications Report

On behalf of the Scouts who attended the Clark Trophy this year, I would like to thank some Amateur radio operators who staffed the communications operation.

Gary, VK7JGD & Anthony, VK7AG who are members of the Wireless Institute Civil Emergency Network (WICEN) volunteered their time to spend the weekend on top of the hill at Rocton farm.

They managed 3 different radio nets providing safety communications for the scout patrols, scoring traffic on another frequency from the various nodes and then on another system forward this down to the base. This system was needed as not all areas of the property could contact the base directly with radio. They also needed to keep a listening watch on the radios overnight in case of emergency.

They also had to keep paper records up to date with scoring info from the nodes as these had to be relayed back to base. Not sure how windy it was up there but all seemed to go well.

Also on air was Coen VK7CAG a licensed youth member from Cygnet who was assisting at the Base location. Tasks included receiving scoring info from operators on the hill and delivering them to the scoring team.

Firstly we assisted a Venturer expedition, coordinated by Alexander Varney (Hellyer Venturers) & Simran Grubb (Leven Venturers). They were joined by Riley Walters-Simpson (Leven) & Brody Elphinstone (Hellyer), riding for 4 days from Trowutta to Zeehan down the Western edge of Tasmania. Over 200k of riding, some big hills & amazing sights along the way, as well as a steak lunch while waiting for the Corinna Ferry. It's not very often a Scout expedition includes such fancy food!













The cycling team now has a number of bike bags & racks that can be hired for any Scouts/Venturers considering a cycling expedition as part of their Peak award. Contact the Cycling Team for more information.



The following week the Cycling Team held another successful MtB camp in Derby. Four days of MtB cycling skills & fun were had, with 20 Scouts & Venturers attending. Participants were able to sign off on much of OAS level 4 MtB cycling, as well as having a great time along the trails. This is fast cementing itself as a great annual event!









This was also the first outing for our newly converted bike trailer. This is now setup to carry 12 Mountain Bikes, or road bikes. Once we've converted our other tailers we will then have 3 bike trailers available for Scout Groups in the NW, North or South to hire.







In 2024 the cycling team will aim to hold a Cycling Training & Leadership weekend, teaching the cycling planning & bike maintenance skills necessary for OAS level 5. During the year we have had visits from cubs scouts and joey scouts, the roving curators from Arts Tasmania, several ex scouts and relatives of old scouts and scouters.

We have received many donations of all sorts of items including a Wolf Cub totem pole from the 1930s covered in small silver wolf heads. It was northern district interpack athletic trophy.

We attended Port Cygnet's 100 years of scouting and The New Norfolk Heritage Festival where we had a display alongside the newly reformed New Norfolk Group.

Our team visited the Rosny TMAG Archive to check what they had in their vaults. ((Not an awful lot as it turns out). We were also taken to the site of "Pickie's Campsite from the 1930s near the Cascade Brewery.

We were very sad to hear that the inspired leader/commissioner who had the insight to start the Tasmanian Scout Heritage Centre in the early 1090s passed away recently. Fran Maddock gave many many hours of hard work and knowledge as well as her own money to form this enviable collection of items of international , national and state significance.
